Kansanshi Dynamos FC End of Season Recap: A Year of Challenges and Changes

he 2023/24 season has been a tumultuous journey for Kansanshi Dynamos Football Club, marked by significant challenges and major changes. Despite the team's relentless efforts, the season concluded with Kansanshi Dynamos finishing second from the bottom in the MTN Super League, resulting in relegation to the National League.



Season Performance and Statistics

Kansanshi Dynamos recorded a total of 35 points from 34 games played, securing eight wins, 11 draws, and enduring 15 losses. The team managed to score 23 goals while conceding 36, highlighting areas for improvement in both offense and defense. Coaching and Management Changes

The conclusion of the season also saw substantial changes in the coaching and management staff. Head Coach Donewell Yobe, who took over mid-season, parted ways with the club after the team's relegation.

Additionally, the services of Technical Adviser Patrick Phiri, Goalkeeper Trainer Ceaser Ndjovu, and Team Manager Kanema Chizombu were not retained, signaling a strategic shift aimed at revitalizing the club's future prospects.

Club President Douglas Nyirenda expressed heartfelt gratitude to the departing staff for their dedication and service. He reaffirmed the club's commitment to building a stronger team capable of competing at the highest level of Zambian football. late in the season.

ansanshi Dynamos Football Club has parted ways with Coach Donewell Yobe following the team's demotion from the MTN Super League. Coach Yobe joined Kansanshi at the start of the 2021/22 season, initially serving under Head Coach Tennat Chilumba.

Coach Yobe was confirmed as Head Coach on March 27, 2024, after serving in an acting capacity from week 11, taking over from Coach Boyd Mulwanda. During his tenure, he managed 23 games, recording seven wins, four draws, and 12 losses.

YOUNG KANSANSHI UNITED TAKES PART IN NATIONAL LEAGUE PLAYOFFS



oung Kansanshi United recently participated in the National Division One playoffs, finishing fourth in Group Two.

The team, coached by Mwape Kasunka, represented the North-Western Province and competed against Mines United of Central Province and River Plate FC of Southern Province, both of whom qualified for National Division One. Other teams in the group included Nangweshi Pirates of Western Province, who finished third, and Katete Rangers of Eastern Province, who came in last.

Coach Kasunka noted that his team learned valuable lessons from the playoffs and is determined to improve in future qualifiers. Young Kansanshi concluded the playoffs with one victory and three losses, earning three points.

ansanshi Dynamos FC striker Justin Kangombe has candidly acknowledged that the lack of goals was a key factor in the team's demotion to the lower league.

The season ended with the team finishing second from the bottom, with only 35 points, leading to their relegation to the National Division One league.

Kangombe, who netted just two goals and provided two assists in 20 appearances, took personal responsibility for the team's struggles. "The season has not been good because we have been relegated, and there's nothing good that comes from that. As a striker, I should have scored more goals to help the team. I failed, and I take part of the blame." He admitted.

Despite the tough season, there were moments that highlighted the potential within the squad. Dave Daka emerged as the club's top scorer with six goals, but the team recorded the lowest number of goals in the league, with just 23.

Kangombe noted that the team's performance was also affected by playing home games away from home for much of the season.
"We played away from home, and while I don't want to make excuses, it did impact us. We only settled in late in the season," he explained.

The return to Independence Stadium in Week 22 showed a marked improvement, with the team losing just one game, drawing two, and winning three in front of their home fans.

Reflecting on the future, Kangombe expressed confidence in the team's ability to bounce back.

"I have played in the National League before. I was recruited to the senior team from the junior team when Kansanshi first got relegated. It's a tough league, but we just need to be united, and we will bring the team back." The player added,

He emphasized the importance of addressing the team's scoring issues from the outset, which he repeatedly acknowledged had been the team's challenge from day one. Kangombe also had a heartfelt message for the fans, expressing gratitude for their massive support especially after returning to Solwezi Independence Stadium.

Additionally, recruiting seasoned strikers with speed and finishing skills will be crucial to enhancing the forward line.

"Looking ahead, our vision is to have at least three players representing us in the National Team. We are confident in our players' potential and committed to further developing their skills," Coach Shimishi emphasized.
